General Epistles: James, 1-2 Peter, 1-3 John, Jude (41)

INTRODUCTION

7 Occasional Letters Written By James, Peter, John Jude – *Apostolic Authority* (Gal 1:19)

Predominant Themes Christ is the God-man who is leading his people

Church is the fulfillment of Israel and he has appointed leaders The people of God are sojourners suffering for the sake of Christ False teaching abounds, so we must walk in truth and love

God's salvation will be accomplished, the wicked will be judged

JAMES Wisdom from God that Leads to Active Faith in an Adulterous World

Author

James, the brother of Jesus, Jude (Matt 13:55); not the apostle; leader in Jerusalem (Acts 15)

Early 40's – Likely written before Jerusalem Council (48-49 AD), may explain 2:14-26

Audience

Jewish Christians (1:1) experiencing trials & suffering (1:2-5) caused by the "Rich" (2:1-9)

Themes (1) Wisdom letter – Reiterates much of the Sermon the Mount

Joy amid trials (1:2 || 5:10-12) Exhortation to be perfect (1:4 || 5:48) Prayer for needs (1:5, 4:2 || 7:7-11) Warning against anger (1:20 || 5:22) Doers of the word (1:22 || 7:24-27) Poor inherit kingdom (2:5 || 5:3, 5)

Keeping the whole law (2:10 || 5:19)

(2) The Word of God (1:19-27) and our words (3:1-4:12) – *Be active hearers, not hasty speakers*

(3) Faith and works (James 2:14-26) – Does James contradict Paul?

(4) Faith and suffering (James 4:13-5:18)

1 PETER Hope-filled Suffering for the Glory of Christ

Author
Peter, an apostle (1:1, cf. 5:1) – A few urge a pseudonymous writer, but this is not compelling
62-63 AD – During the oppressive reign of Nero (AD 54-68); Likely written from Rome (5:13)

Audience

Peter, an apostle (1:1, cf. 5:1) – A few urge a pseudonymous writer, but this is not compelling
62-63 AD – During the oppressive reign of Nero (AD 54-68); Likely written from Rome (5:13)

"elect exiles of the dispersion" (cf Acts 2) – Gentiles from Modern-Day Turkey (1:14, 18; 4:3-4)

Themes (1) Those who suffer as Christians will be exalted (1:6-9; 2:18-25; 3:13-22; 4:12-19)

(2) Christ died as a substitute (1:17-21; 2:24; 3:13-22) – *His death is also exemplary* (2:21-23)

(3) Authority and submission (Government: 2:13-17; Marriage: 3:1-7; Church: 5:1-6)

(4) New life in Christ is the basis for all good works (1:3; 1:13-2:3)

2 PETER Growing in the Knowledge of the Grace of God

Author Simeon Peter, a servant and apostle (1:1) – *There are many who contend his authorship*

(1) Simeon Peter (1:1); (2) Eyewitness (1:16-18; cf Matt 17:1-8); (3) Deliberate deception Why differences – Peter may have used a different scribe, Peter may be dependent on Jude

Date AD 64-67, before Peter died while he was in Rome

Audience Unspecified Christians, likely same people as before (3:1) – *Warning of false teachers*

Themes (1) True knowledge of God's grace results in godliness (1:3-15)

(2) Word of God is more sure than personal experience (1:16-21; cf. 3:15)

(3) False teachers are ethically bankrupt & bound for destruction (2:1-22)

(4) Redemption is Cosmic (3:1-7, 11-13) & Personal (3:8-10)

1 JOHN

Knowing That You Know Christ

Author

John, the apostle

Introduction fits John, the beloved disciple (cf. John 19:26-27; 20:2-10)

Style and vocabulary – "Believe" (v), not "Faith" (n)

Themes – divinity & humanity, believing & practicing, primacy of love

Date

AD 90's – Polycarp and Papias cite John's letters (ca. AD 100)

Audience Occasion Themes Writing from/to Ephesus (Jerusalem to Ephesus ca. AD 67); unspecified congregation (2:19) Gnosticism (2:22-23; 4:1-6)? Schism (2:19)? – *More positive* (1:4; 2:1, 12-14, 26; 3:11; 5:13)

- (1) The Son of God (1:1-4; 2:1-2; 3:8; 4:1-6, 9-10, 14; 5:12)
- (2) Fruit of the New Birth (6x: 2:29; 3:9; 4:7; 5:1, 4, 18)
 - Practice truth/righteousness (1:6; 2:29; 3:7, 10)
 - Walk in the light/as he walked (1:7; 2:6)
 - Confess sins and have forgiveness (1:9; 2:12)
 - Keep/obey his commandments/Word (2:3, 5; 3:22, 24; 5:2, 3)
 - Love one another/the brothers (2:10; 3:10, 11, 14, 16, 18, 23; 4:7, 11, 21)
 - Overcome the evil one/them/the world (2:13, 14; 4:4; 5:4)
 - Do the will of God/cannot keep on sinning (2:17; 3:9, 22)
 - Confess the Son/believe in Jesus (2:23; 3:23; 4:2, 15; 5:1, 4, 13)

<u>**2 JOHN**</u>

Walking in the Truth, Loving One Another

Author Date

John, the apostle/elder – based on writing style, position in the canon, theological outlook

AD 90's – see above

Audience

"The elect lady" – Most likely a congregation; most of 2 John is 2nd Person Plural (v. 5)

Church is (1) feminine, (2) pictured as a bride, (3) used as a social subunit

Themes

- (1) Living out the truth (vv. 1-2, 4, 6) in love (vv. 5-6)
- (2) Love without truth is not love (v. 7-11) Benevolence should be checked by truth (v. 10-11)
- (3) False teaching abounds (v. 7-11) *False teachers are not welcome*
- (4) Genuine community is personal (v. 12) and universal (v. 13) See also 3 John 13-15

3 JOHN

Cooperation for Sake of the Name

Author Date

John, the apostle/elder – elder is a term used of pastoral leaders in the NT (Acts 14:23; 20:17)

AD 90's – see above

Occasion

Its been suggested that 1-3 John were originally "stapled"; 3 John was a personal letter

Audience

Gaius is likely the pastor, or lead elder of the church

Themes

- (1) John's joy is seeing his children walking in truth (v. 3-4)
- (2) Support Christian workers is needed and commended by God (v. 5-8)
- (3) Church discipline is not optional, but essential for healthy churches (v. 9-10)
- (4) Church leadership is based upon reputation a bad reputation disqualifies (v. 11)

<u>JUDE</u>

Contending for the Faith By Keeping Yourself in Love with God

Author Date Audience Jude, brother of Jesus but identifies himself as "servant of Jesus Christ, brother of James"

Mid-60's – Similar themes as 2 Peter puts it at the same time

Audience "the called, beloved in God the Father and kept for Jesus Christ" (v. 2) – unspecified Christians **Themes** (1) False Teachers – Sought to commend salvation, turns attention to 'creepers' (v. 3-4)

- (2) OT Interpretation Jesus leads Exodus (v. 5); Sodom & Gomorrah (vv. 7-8; Gen 19); Cain, Balaam & Korah (v. 11-13; Gen 4; Num 31:16; Num 16), Enoch (v. 14-16; 1 Enoch)
- (3) False Teachers God will judge them, Character counts more than charisma
- (4) Angelology Fallen angels (v. 6), Michael and the devil (v. 9) Who do you pray to?
- (5) Perseverance Your who are kept (v. 2), keep yourself in the love of God (v. 19-23)

 How do you keep yourself in the love of God? (1) Faith, (2) Prayer, (3) Hope
